Small Business Innovation Research and Small Business Technology Transfer Programs Overview

Purpose and Priorities

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To stimulate technological innovation and increase private sector commercialization among small business concerns and enable them to undertake and to obtain the benefits of research and development in order to maintain and strengthen the competitive free enterprise system and the national economy.

- Transforming scientific discovery and innovation for both social and economic benefit
- Emphasizing private sector commercialization

Eligibility

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- Only previous SBIR/STTR Phase I awardees who have not previously applied for Phase II are eligible to apply through this RFA
- Each applicant must qualify as a small business concern (SBC) through registration with the SBA for R/R&D purposes at the time of award
- An SBIR/STTR awardee must be
 - Small business
 - a for-profit entity
 - Independent business within the United States

Application Changes from Prior Year

- First year STTR included in the USDA SBIR program
- Minor but impactful changes in formatting
 - Project narrative
 - Commercialization plan

- Total funding available for FY2023
 - SBIR: \$19,500,000
 - STTR: \$2,812,000
- Program Code: 8.1/8.2/8.3/8.4/8.5/8.6/8.7/8.8/8.12/8.13
- Maximum funding per award: \$650,000 (including TABA)

- Project Summary/Abstract
- Project Narrative
- Bibliography/Reference List
- Facilities & Other Resources
- Equipment Documentation
- Commercialization Plan
- Other Documents (See RFA and NIFA Grants Application Guide)

Application Details (contd.)

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- Project Narrative: 20-page limit and will be strictly enforced.
 - ⁻ 1.5 line spacing and at least 1-inch margins
 - 12-point Times New Roman font
 - Includes text, figures and tables
 - o Tables and figures: no smaller than 11-point Times New Roman
 - Tables may be single spaced
- Commercialization Plan: Not to exceed 10 pages
 - 1.5 line spacing and at least 1-inch margins
 - 12-point Times New Roman
 - Tables and figures: no smaller than 11-point Times New Roman
- Applications exceeding the page limits will be returned without review.

Application Submission

- NIFA only accepts electronic submission of applications.
- NIFA Grants Application Guide available: <u>nifa.usda.gov/resource/nifa-grantsgov-application-guide</u>
- Application documents must be in Portable Document Format (PDF) to be accepted by NIFA, including your narrative and budget justifications.
 - Grants.gov may allow other formats, but NIFA does <u>not</u>
 - Do not use third-party PDF builders

Application Submission Check

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Applications will be excluded from the competitive review process for the following reasons (list is not all inclusive):

- Projects that seek funding solely for product development where no research is involved;
- Budget requests that exceed the ceiling of \$600,000 or \$650,000 including TABA;
- Summary/Abstract exceeds one page and/or is not in PDF format;
- Project Narrative exceeds 20 pages of written text and/or is not in PDF format
- Application is submitted after the 5:00 p.m. Eastern deadline.



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Proposal Evaluation Process

Initial Screening Criteria

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- The proposing firm must qualify as a small business concern
- The application must meet application content and format requirements
- The proposed budget must be within the dollar ceiling identified in the RFA
- The proposed Phase II research must fall within the topic area that the project was originally funded under Phase I
- An application must contain adequate scientific/technical and market opportunity information that clearly states the project plan and objectives

Evaluation Criteria

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- Degree to Which Phase I Objectives were Met and Technical Feasibility Established
- 2. Phase II Scientific and Technical Feasibility
- 3. Commercial Potential
- 4. Importance of the Problem
- 5. Investigator and Resource Qualifications
- 6. Budget
- 7. Duplication

Additional factors: CRADA

Evaluation Process

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Proposals are assigned for review to at least 3 technical and 2 commercial reviewers with expertise in the proposed topic.

Reviewers will produce individual reviews of each proposal, evaluating the strengths and weaknesses.

These written
reviews are used to
begin panel
discussions with
other reviewers
serving on the peerreview panel.

Through these discussions, peer-review panelists come to consensus on the final rating and ranking of proposals.

- Request for Application (RFA) released Dec 23, 2022
- Proposal writing and planning
- Proposals due: March 28, 2023
- @ 5:00 PM (EDT)
- Proposal under peer review
- Proposal funding notifications
- Awards are finalized and made
- Awards start:Sept 1, 2023

On average, a competitive program takes about <u>3-5 months</u> from the proposal due date to an award being made to an institution.



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
