- NIFA **invests in and supports** initiatives that ensure the long-term viability of agriculture.
- NIFA provides **funding and strategic leadership** for programs that ensure groundbreaking discoveries in agriculture-related sciences and technologies reach the people who can put them into practice.

Program Overview

Food and Agriculture Defense Initiative Extension Disaster Education Network (FADI-EDEN)



Purpose of FADI-EDEN

- The goal is to maximize the resilience of the U.S. food and agriculture sector to biosecurity risks, extreme weather events and disasters, cyber threats, and other shocks.
- The purpose of this program is to enhance and expand the Cooperative Extension System's outreach activities with a focus on biosecurity before, during, and after disasters.



RFA | Part I

Historical Strength of FADI-EDEN



- Historically, a strength of the FADI-EDEN program has been its ties to the Extension Disaster Education Network (the Network).

Priorities of FADI-EDEN

The FADI-EDEN program will fund **one Extension project** that will address its priorities:

- Foster interdisciplinary and multi-state education and outreach programs
- Build and/or enhance strategic partnerships
- Support collaboration
- Facilitate coordination



Available Funding

- The anticipated amount available for the FADI-EDEN program in FY 2023 is approximately \$382,400 that will be provided on a continuation basis for a total of four years (FY 2024, FY 2025, and FY 2026) based on availability of funding in subsequent years and on annual satisfactory performance of the project.
- This award will be issued as a cooperative agreement.



Eligibility

- Applicants must meet all the requirements discussed in this RFA. Failure to meet the eligibility criteria by the application deadline may result in exclusion from consideration or, preclude NIFA from making an award.
- In accordance with section 1472(c) of the National Agricultural Research, Extension, and Teaching Policy Act of 1977 (NARETPA), applicants may be:
 - State agricultural experiment stations
 - State cooperative extension services
 - All colleges and universities
 - Other research or education institutions and organizations,
 - Federal and private agencies and organizations,
 - Individuals, and
 - Any other contractor or recipient, either foreign or domestic, to further research, extension, or teaching programs in the food and agricultural sciences of the Department of Agriculture.



Matching

- There is **no matching** requirement for the FADI-EDEN program.
- NIFA will not factor matching resources into the review process as an evaluation criterion.



Funding Restrictions

- Information about **indirect costs for the FADI-EDEN program** is available in the RFA; applicants are strongly encouraged to review this information.
- Successful applicants must not use grant funds awarded under the authority of this RFA to renovate or refurbish research, education, or extension space; purchase or install fixed equipment in such space; or to plan, repair, rehabilitate, acquire, or construct buildings or facilities.



Expected Reporting Requirements

- The awardee is required to submit project initiation information and reports. This
 will facilitate both awardee submissions of initial award information and
 subsequent subcontracted project information, project outcomes, and provides
 transparency via public access to information on Federally funded projects.
- The awardee is expected to submit progress reports to NIFA and the EDEN executive committee and to submit a final technical report to NIFA and the EDEN executive committee. The awardee is also expected to provide written monthly updates on project progress during EDEN executive committee meetings.
- The awardee will also be required to provide data and information, as identified, through USDA-sponsored evaluation activities and calls for programmatic data.

 - 1. Letter of Intent *deadline is listed in the RFA*
 - 2. Application *deadline is listed in the RFA*



Letter of Intent (LOI)

- This is a **newly identified recommendation** for FADI-EDEN.
- The LOI is strongly encouraged for application submission.
- Format:
 - 1-inch margins
 - Times New Roman, 12-point font
 - Single-spaced text with double spaces between paragraphs
 - Page size must be letter (i.e., 8.5 inches by 11 inches) and submitted as a PDF (Portable Document Format) file



RFA | Part IV

Letter of Intent – What to Include

- The LOI is **limited to 3 pages**.
- Page 1
 - The name, professional title, department, institution, and email address of the project director (PD)
 - Name, professional title, department, and institution of all collaborating investigators (co-PDs)

• Pages 2-3

- Descriptive project title
- Objectives
- Approach or Methodology
- Potential impacts and expected outcomes



RFA | Part IV

Letter of Intent – Submission

LOIs are due by 5:00 pm Eastern on the deadline date

Application Requirements At-A-Glance

Applications are due by 5:00 pm Eastern on the deadline date

Application Component	Page Limit
Table of contents*	1 page
 Project narrative Includes tables and figures 	30 pages
Data management plan (DMP)	2 pages
Commitment letters	No page limit
Bibliography	No page limit

Application Formatting

- Project Narrative is **30-page limit** and will be strictly enforced
 - **1.5 spacing**, 1-inch margins
 - 12-point Times New Roman font
 - This page limit includes tables and figures
- The page limits and parameters ensure fair and equitable competition
- Do not add appendices to circumvent the page limit

Page(s) that exceed the page limit of Project Narrative will not be reviewed



Application Sections

- For the project narrative, use the section headings outlined in the RFA:
 - Section A: Introduction
 - Section B: Rational and Significance
 - Section C: Goals and Objectives
 - Section D: Approach or Methodology
 - Section E: Project Management Plan
 - Section F: Project Performance Assessment
 - Section G: Project Timeline
 - Section H: Institutional Involvement
 - Section I: Logic Model
- For information on commitment letters and bibliography, refer to the RFA.



RFA | Part IV

Data Management Plan (DMP)

- Limited to 2 pages
- Includes:
 - Expected data type
 - Data format
 - Data storage and preservation
 - Data sharing, protection, and public access
 - Roles and responsibilities

Other Information

- In the RFA, additional information is listed for required application components that include but are not limited to:
 - Project Summary
 - Other Attachments
 - Senior/Key Person Profile
 - Budget
 - Supplemental Information

Application and Submission

- NIFA only accepts electronic submission of applications
- NIFA Grants Application Guide available: https://nifa.usda.gov/resource/nifa-grantsgovapplication-guide
- Application documents must be in Portable Document Format (PDF) to be accepted by NIFA, including your narrative and budget justifications
 - Grants.gov may allow other formats, but NIFA does not
 - Do not use third-party PDF builders

RFA | Part V

Evaluation Process

Proposals will be assigned for review to at least 3 reviewers with expertise in the proposed topic

Reviewers will produce individual reviews of each proposal, evaluating the strengths and weaknesses

These written reviews will be used to begin panel discussions with other reviewers who serve on the peerreview panel

Through these discussions, peerreview panelists will come to consensus on the final rating and ranking of proposals



Evaluation Criteria

NIFA will use the following criteria, weighted equally, to evaluate applications:

- Potential for Enhancing and Expanding the Cooperative Extension System's Outreach Activities with a Focus on Biosecurity Before, During, and After Disasters
- Proposed Approach and Cooperative Linkages
- Institutional Capacity
- Key Personnel
- Outcome Evaluation Plan
- Budget and Cost-Effectiveness



Tentative Timeline of Competitive Programs



- Request for Application (RFA) Release
- Application writing and planning
- Applications due

- Applications are under peer review
- Proposal funding notifications

 Awards are finalized and made


